



COVID FLOWCHART FOR STUDENTS

(Updated 1/3/22)

Student reports he/she is **positive for COVID-19.**

Student will isolate from school for **5 days** from symptom onset or **24 hour** symptom free whichever is longer. Student must wear a mask at all times if returning to school prior to 10 days.

If student is able to isolate from siblings, follow the Household Contact column for siblings. If the student is unable to isolate, the siblings remain home for 5 days from the end of the positive case's isolation period, and must wear a mask at all times if returning to school prior to 10 days from the last contact. If the siblings are vaccinated (with booster or less than 6 months since 2nd shot) and symptom free they may come to school. The school may require them to check-in each morning to monitor symptoms.

Student has a fever of 100.4 F or higher or has **1 major or 2 or more moderate symptoms.**

Student/Parent should contact their primary care physician for guidance.

For illnesses other than COVID, the student may return after they have been free of all major symptoms for at least **24 hours**, without the use of medication.

Student receives notification that a classmate or teammate has tested positive.

The student receiving the notification can stay **IN SCHOOL** if he/she is symptom free.

Current known symptoms (major in bold):

- Fever (100.4 or higher)**
- New loss of taste or smell**
- Shortness of Breath**
- Diarrhea**
- Vomiting**
- Congestion/ Runny nose
- Muscles and body aches
- Fatigue
- Headache
- Sore throat
- Cough
- Chills
- Nausea/Vomiting

Student is a Household Contact, meaning someone in their home is positive and the student is unable to isolate from that person.

A vaccinated student (with booster or less than 6 months since 2nd shot) can stay in school if symptom free.

A students who provides proof of a positive COVID test within the last 6 months can stay in school if symptom free.

An unvaccinated, household student remains home for 5 days from the end of the positive case's isolation period, and must wear a mask at all times if returning to school prior to 10 days from last contact.

Student reports **someone in their home was exposed to someone who tested positive or has symptoms.**

If someone at home is not symptomatic, but just 'exposed,' student may come to school.

There is no need to self-isolate if the student is a contact of a contact.
