

THE FAR SIDE OF FR. DARYL

If you have been to a movie theatre recently you are aware of what is asked of all movie goers just before the movie begins. They ask for all to keep their feet off the seat in front of them, they request no talking during the movie and they state anyone using a cell phone during the movie will be asked to leave and will not be allowed back in. If you think about these things they are not things the movie theatre is against, rather they are stating what should be recognized as common courtesy. Common courtesy seems to have been forgotten in our world today and that includes what takes place in church.

I bring this up not only as a reminder but because of what I experience here on the weekends. We celebrate Baptism's after the 5:00 pm Mass on Saturdays and the 1:00 pm Mass on Sundays. Too often during the Baptism, conversations will be taking place elsewhere in the Church. And the priest who is celebrating the Baptism has to compete with the conversation. It would seem to be common courtesy to recognize that a sacrament is being celebrated. One should be respectful of the priest and the family, and continue their conversation in one of the three gathering spaces we have here at St. Francis, but this is not always what takes place. I myself have a difficult time concentrating on the celebration when I have to compete with other conversations in the background. So I ask when you see celebrations taking place after Mass, please enjoy your conversations in the gathering space.

The Church is to be a place of worship and it is for this reason that respectful silence is requested when in the Church. We do not have a great deal of time between Masses and our common courtesy is to be respectful of those who are praying. The appropriate place to enter into conversations is in the gathering spaces. The Sanctuary lamp reminds us that Christ is present and proper reverence should be observed.

Since I mentioned cell phones, I might as well talk about them as well. Not only does a ringing cell phone disturb the celebration of Mass, it is also a distraction to everyone at the Mass. Personally, I keep my cell phone on silent mode 98% of the time. I do not feel like those around me should be bothered by my phone ringing. The preference is for all to leave their phone in the vehicle during mass or to turn it off when you come into church, but at the very least, common courtesy will tell all to put it on silent mode. If there is an emergency and you need to respond, please do so in the gathering space.

One more thing while I am thinking about it. I invite all to consider a little less movement around the church during the celebration. The priest celebrating the Mass does see all that goes on. It is a disadvantage having the drinking fountains and the restrooms in the church. When I was growing up, we simply weren't allowed to leave the pew during Mass. Unless it is absolutely necessary a drink of water can wait until after mass and the same can be said about using the restroom. Most especially during the Eucharistic prayer and Consecration. I find it disheartening when I raise the body and blood of Christ and see people leaving the pew for a drink of water.

So let us all remember these common courtesies during Mass. It is respectful of others who are seeking to prayerfully and reverently celebrate the Mass and it leads to a more sacred celebration for all.
